31	Sec. 2. Section 501 of the Rental Housing Act of 1985, effective July 17, 1985 (D.C. Law	
32	6-10; D.C. Official Code § 42-3505.01), is amended by adding a new subsection (q) to read as	
33	follows:	
34	"(q) Any notice to vacate, including notices to vacate for nonpayment of rent, must be	
35	sent by the housing provider to the District of Columbia's Office of the Tenant Advocate within	
36	two days after the notice is served on the tenant. This notice can be sent via certified mail, hand	
37	delivery, fax, or electronic mail. A housing provider who fails to comply with this subsection	

shall not be entitled to recover possession of the housing unit(s) in any proceeding. Within four 1 2 (4) days of receipt of any notice pursuant to this subsection, the Office of the Tenant Advocate 3 shall send via certified mail to all tenants identified, a notice of basic housing rights and resources, a list of tenants' rights organizations with their contact information, a list of 4 5 organizations that provide rental payment assistance, and a list of organizations that provide legal 6 advice for tenants facing eviction. The Office may use other means in addition to certified mail 7 to contact the tenant(s). 8 Sec. 3.
